Volker Hartung and the Cologne New Philharmonic Orchestra

Since 1972, the Cologne New Philharmonic has been a household name in the classical scene. For 50 years now, in addition to symphonic masterpieces, it has presented its audience with balanced and powerful programs from the rich repertoire of works by great masters. Under its roof, it created a unique platform that offers young professionals the increasingly rare opportunity to participate in extraordinary concert projects beyond the boundaries of their studies and professional lives.

The orchestra administers itself in the legal form of a non-profit association and is under the musical direction of its chief conductor Volker Hartung and any guest conductors.

Members of the Cologne New Philharmonic are predominantly particularly gifted young graduates of musical education institutions in the Cologne area as well as prizewinners of international competitions.

As a unique feature, this results in an interpretation style characterized by extreme faithfulness to the work on the one hand and, on the other hand, by exuberant élan as well as the joy of playing, extraordinary temperament, and musical wit at the highest artistic level. Musicians from all over the world have found their musical home in the Cologne New Philharmonic and have given the orchestra international

splendor on numerous tours abroad.

Today, musicians from over 50 nations play in the best positions of renowned international symphony orchestras worldwide, who owe their artistic development to their participation in the Junge Philharmonie Köln, so that critics have rightly described the orchestra as a "soloist forge."

Examples in the past are the collaboration with the exceptional British violinist Nigel Kennedy as well as the worldwide guest performances of the Junge Philharmonie Köln, e.g., at the opera house in Sydney, Australia, or at the international film festival in Cannes, which have consolidated the orchestra's reputation as a top formation.

Since 1990, the Cologne New Philharmonic has played every year in the Kölner Philharmonie, usually to sold-out houses, whereby its chief conductor Volker Hartung simultaneously supports the young musicians individually through solo performances, often supported by public foundations and scholarships. Through Hartung's continuous development work, the orchestra has gained an international reputation and has the highest performance standards due to its players' high quality.

In 2023, Cologne New Philharmonic will be 51 years old - thanks to its loyal audience, which spurs it on to continue to perfect itself.

On their travels around the globe, the musicians often do pioneering work:

concert tours through villages and small towns where otherwise, rarely a foreign orchestra appears.

When it comes to Australia, for example, the Cologne New Philharmonic not only plays in Sydney's famous opera house but also undertakes extensive

The main concern of the young artists is to make the sensual and emotional driving forces of music palpable – regardless of whether they play music of the Romantic era or venture into the realms of so-called underground music. Or when they suspense the film music by Bernard Hermann, tangos by Carlos Gardel, or follow in the footsteps of the Cologne bard Willi Ostermann.

Because this balancing act succeeds as the artists demonstrate their love of music, the Cologne New Philharmonic continues to inspire its audiences to this day.

Volker Hartung Conductor

Volker Hartung studied viola and chamber music at the municipal conservatory and the Musikhochschule Köln with Gérard Ruymen and the Amadeus Quartet. He was a scholarship holder at the Juilliard School of Music in New York in viola and conducting. He attended master classes with Rainer Moog, Gérard Caussé, Bruno Giuranna, and Sandor Vegh and played for many years as principal violist with the "Klassische Philharmonie Bonn." Another scholarship took him to the Juilliard School of Music in New York and the California Institute of the Arts in Los Angeles, where he studied with Ivan Galamian, the Juilliard Quartet, Josef Gingold, Alan de Veritch, and the Budapest String Quartet. He also became a member of the Pacific Symphony Orchestra and the Los Angeles Chamber Orches-

Since 1986 Volker Hartung has been the principal conductor of the

Cologne New Philharmonic. Numerous tours have taken him with the orchestra all over the world. Productions followed this with the St. Petersburg Philharmonic Orchestra, the Leipzig Radio Orchestra, the Hamburg Camerata, and the Sofia Philharmonic. Together with Nigel Kennedy and the Cologne New Philharmonic, he undertook a European tour and, with his orchestra a

triumphant world tour 2019 through all major cities of China.

As a guest conductor, Hartung participated in numerous projects. He has worked with the MDR Radio Orchestra and the MDR Kammerphilharmonie and conducted concert productions at the Sydney Opera House in Australia.

In 2006 he was appointed Professor of Conducting and Chamber Music at the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts in Singapore. There he built up the symphony orchestra of the conservatory.

In 2013 he conducted in China at the invitation of the Shanghai Philharmonic Orchestra, which was followed by numerous other invitations. The event was broadcast live on Chinese radio.

His lectures on music history and performance techniques are in demand internationally.

Volker Hartung has been broadcast in numerous radio and television programs: MDR Leipzig, SWR Radio Stuttgart, Bayern Radio, WDR, and ARD.

He has an extensive repertoire from all musical epochs. He continuously expands this and passes it on to his musicians in intensive rehearsals, resulting in breathtaking performances for the audience. A particular focus of his work is the promotion and development of young talents, whom he has been bringing to professional music practice for over three decades. As part of the Cologne New Philharmonic concert series, he provides them with international, highly regarded solo concerts and performances at his events.

An extensive discography documents the versatile artistic work of Volker Hartung.








